13th May, 2007 :Took oath as Chief Minister of Uttar Pradesh for the fourth

time, after the BSP registered a comfortable majority win in the Uttar Pradesh Legislative Assembly general election,

thrashing both the Samajwadi Party and the BJP.

3 July, 2007 : Was administered oath of office as (MLC) Member of Uttar

Pradesh Legislative Council, after elected unopposed to Upper Chamber of state legislature. Responding to the choice to enter the house through the legislative council rather than the assembly election route, I have told media that "I have won several Assembly and Lok Sabha elections and could have easily been elected to the assembly this time also. But I chose to become MLC as I wish to concentrate on the development of all 403 assembly constituencies of the state rather than my constituency only.... I am not Mulayam Singh Yadav, who had diverted all funds to develop his home area only..."
